Why is Keswick ConVenture important to the Boys' Brigade?

We feel that there are two main areas where many BB companies are not delivering as well as they could. This is affecting the BB's ability to retain Seniors and develop them into leaders which, in turn, affects its ability to grow. The first area is the provision of true adventure We believe that the Scout activities. Movement's phenomenal growth since the new millennium is partly due to its re-emphasis on adventure activities in its Explorer Units; this has enabled the Scouts to retain their older youth members and develop many of them into new leaders. There are, of course, other factors, but we believe this is an important element of their success which, if the BB is to grow, it must emulate. The second area is one that is unique to the BB as a Christian organisation with its object of advancing Christ's Kingdom. In general, we have not been very successful at winning our older members for Christ and discipling them (and our younger leaders also) in their faith. We need to improve both areas if we are to create the next generation of effective leaders to grow the Brigade. Keswick ConVenture aims to provide an opportunity to address both deficiencies and we hope it might be the first of many events that combine adventure and spirituality.



What is Keswick ConVenture? Keswick ConVenture is an opportunity to participate in a wide range of adventure activities in the daytime and to attend one of the country's main Christian festivals in the evening.

When and Where will it take place?

It will take place during the second Keswick Convention week from Friday 20 to Wednesday 25 July 2018. It will be based at a campsite to be set up on the playing field at Braithwaite (2.5 miles from Keswick). The campsite has toilets and showers and we will have the use of part of the Braithwaite Institute for cooking and eating.

Who is it for?

It is for individual or groups of BB leaders and exmembers as well as Seniors (15-18). Leaders can come on their own, but Seniors must be accompanied by a BB leader. We are particularly keen to attract ex-members of the BB who are now at university or work and who risk losing contact with the BB. All participants must provide suitable clothes for the activities, including good waterproofs, a daysack and sturdy boots. Participants must also provide and pitch their own tents.

How much will it cost?

It is hard to predict costs at this stage, as we don't know how many volunteer instructors and how many bought-in professional instructors will be required. Last year, with a 3-day programme, manned exclusively by our own instructors, the charge was £50 per person, including food. For this year's larger 4-day programme we will aim to keep the cost below £100 per person, including food.
